As a public school, the University has to follow the legal regulations governed by the Higher Education Act together with its implementation guidelines.

These regulations also control in great detail the: qualifications for granting scientific and professional titles; requirements for the research and teaching staff; programs for different courses; admission requirements; principles guiding the acceptance of credits from other universities; and conditions that constitute the basis for student dismissal. A university's own implementation and adherence to the rules and regulations commonly in effect as well as its adherence to its internal regulations, e.g., the Statute or School Rules and Regulations, are subject to the institutional control of the Minister of Science and Higher Education.

Payment rules for the tuition are determined by a collegial organization at the University, the Senate, and the fee levels by the highest individual in authority, the President of the University. The University charges only for the tuition and the dormitory accommodations. In the case of a student's resignation, the student is refunded the amount of tuition for the unused part of it, i.e., the time counted from the date of receipt of the student's notification to the University of the decision to withdraw. The University does not reimburse the tuition for the completed part of the studies. All of these rules are included in the agreement between the University and each student. According to the current legal regulations in Poland, international students studying in Poland who are enrolled in a school that charges tuition are not eligible for student financial aid offered by Polish governmental authorities. The University, just like every other school of higher learning in Poland, does not offer job placement to its alumni.
